Let a Songbird Fly	<i>A modern barbershop song</i>
Your Shining Eyes	<i>A madrigal from 1604, written by Thomas Bateson, organist at ChristChurch cathedral, Dublin</i>
It's Beginning to look a lot like Christmas	<i>Written in 1951 by Meredith Wilson. Recorded by Perry Como and Bing Crosby in the same year.</i>
Mister Sandman	<i>1954 song written by Pat Ballard and became the first hit for 'The Chordettes'</i>
Ave Verum	<i>This catholic Eucheristic hymn dates from the 14th century and is attributed to Pope Innocent VI.</i>
Cowboy Carol	<i>Cecil Broadhurst and Sir Malcolm Sargent collaborated and it was first performed in 1942.</i>
I Dreamed a Dream	<i>From the 1980 musical 'Les Misérables' based on the 1862 novel by Victor Hugo.</i>
Whispering	<i>Schoenburger, Coburn and Rose popular 1920 song.</i>
Carol of the Bells	<i>Penned by Ukranian Mykola Leontovych in 1914 from a folk chant 'Shchedryk'</i>

The Christmas Song	<i>Written in 1945 by Bob Wells and Mel Torme.</i>
The Way You Look Tonight	<i>Academy Award-winning 1936 song written for the film 'Swing Time' and performed by Fred Astaire.</i>
Over the Rainbow	<i>Written for the 1939 Movie 'The Wizard of Oz' and sung by Judy Garland.</i>
Teddy Bear's Picnic	<i>Music written in 1907, with lyrics added in 1932</i>
Away in a Manger	<i>A late 19th-century carol, voted joint second most popular by a 1996 Gallup poll.</i>
The Goslings	<i>A sad love song, written by John Frederick Bridge in 1913.</i>
Sentimental Journey	<i>Published in 1944 and Doris Day's 1st No 1 in 1945.</i>
Winter Wonderland	<i>Bernard and Smith wrote this standard in 1934. It has been recorded by over 200 artists.</i>
Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas	<i>Judy Garland sang this in 'Meet Me in St Louis'</i>
